EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Introduction

The annual report of Garden City University for the period 2019 – 2020 provides a bird's eye view of the various academic and administrative activities of the University. The academic year 2019 - 2020 has been a remarkable year encompassing several opportunities and challenges. The first part of the academic year was successfully executed as per the calendar and the second part of the academic year warranted a need for amendment of the calendar due to COVID-19. The various activities such as conduct of International and National level events, International collaborations with private and public institutions, Research, Innovation and IPR developmental activities, International Student Exchange programmes, contribution to University Social Responsibility activities such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan were the highlights of the year. The second half of the academic year started with the regular calendar and continued till 13th March 2020. Due to the emergence of COVID-19, a revised academic calendar was designed in a decisive manner considering the compliance required to meet the academic as well as administrative activities of the University. The revised calendar was put forward to the academic approving bodies; further to their approval it was communicated to all the stakeholders involved in the University operations. The stakeholders include students, research scholars, faculty members, parents, non-teaching staff and support staff. The detailed report of the University operations is discussed in this annual report.

About the report

The annual report 2019 – 2020 details the efforts and activities taken up by the IQAC cell enforcing quality in all activities across the University - both academic and nonacademic activities. The report includes the list of academic programmes the University is offering for the academic year. It also includes the details of the various value-added courses offered by each school on entrepreneurship and

employment in their respective field of expertise and specialization. The curriculum followed in the University is crafted very carefully keeping in mind the current advances in various fields of study. The team involved in curating the syllabi includes academic subject matter experts from various disciplines along with experts from the Industry. The list of members of statutory bodies forming the University for the academic year 2019 – 20 are included in the report. The mode of admission as to how students are admitted for different programmes of the University are detailed. It also includes the details of students like enrolment details, scholarship report, and student diversity in the University. The various events hosted by the University are also the highlights in the report.

The report includes information about the faculty members and their achievements for the academic year 2019 - 2020. The details of the faculty members who have participated in various development programmes that were conducted in-house and participated in other institutions are listed in the report. The performance and achievements of students along with their student learning competencies are the major highlights of the report. Usage of Learning Management System (LMS) by the students were remarkable in terms of assignment submission, attendance monitoring and Continuous Internal Assessment being completely online.

The report includes details of internship and placement records of the final year students of the University, method of conduct of examination and evaluation pattern for both undergraduates and post graduates. Garden City University witnessed achieving another milestone of the first batch of Post graduate students rolling out and the details of the conduct of first convocation are mentioned in the report.

The IQAC cell and the Research and Innovation Council (RIC) of the University were very active during the academic year 2019 – 2020 and the various activities under the umbrella of IQAC and



RIC like Inter-departmental collaborations, Industry-Academic Collaborative activities, Webinars, Seminars, Industrial visits, contribution by external resource persons, International conferences, collaborations and memberships, departmental journal publications, departmental library details and University library are detailed in the report. The IQAC cell of the University has closely worked with each department across all schools of the University to identify innovative teaching methods and handheld each of the departments and schools to implement them in their respective classes. The IQAC cell conducted SWOC analysis to identify the new upcoming challenges in each department and each school and helped them in overcoming their challenges as opportunities and enhance the strength of their respective schools.

Another feather in the cap of GCU is the University Social Responsibility (USR) which includes active participation in activities like Awareness on Digi-locker, a skill development workshop titled "Low cost – locally available healthy beverages" conducted for the NSS volunteers across all states of the country as a part of the special camp named 'NSS - Golden Jubilee celebration 2019', activities of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan under the title "GCU Swachh" and adoption of villages are a few to mention.

The parent – teachers' meeting, mentor-mentee activities, the NSS and NCC activities and sports activities were regular activities of the University as per the Calendar for the academic year 2019 – 2020.

The University also has a very effective International Cell that helps the students of our University to register for

Student exchange programmes with other International Universities. During the year, the University organized Student exchange programmes with Sorbonne University, Paris and Camilo Jose Cela University, Spain. The details of the visit are available in the report.

Curriculum Design at GCU

The curriculum followed in the University is crafted very carefully keeping in mind the advances in the field of study. The University has adopted the Choice Based Credit System of curriculum design and the students and faculty members have adapted well with the system. The curriculum is curated with the recommendations from experts in the field of academics and industry. This is followed in order to bridge the gap between academia and industry.

A University that grows with the students

The student enrolment witnessed a positive momentum from the previous academic year. Deserving students were awarded scholarship amounting INR 5 crores and 99 thousand. Besides, 7 other external scholarships have been facilitated to the students of the University.

With the legacy of being a host to students over 81 nations, the academic year 2019 – 2020 witnessed student representations from 4 countries and all the states and union territories of India.

The overall results of the end semester examination showed a prudent pass of 77% in the Undergraduate programmes and 95% in the Post graduate programmes.

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The University has instituted 7 gold medals for the first batch of Post Graduate students. The concept of Gold medal is based on recognizing the stalwarts in the academic fraternity and to create a source of motivation among the students to aspire and excel in their life taking inspirations from the personalities.

Caring for the students

Garden City University has always taken all efforts to cater to students who are staying in the hostel and provide experience as home away from home. As the freshers arrive on the campus for the first time, the University conducted Fresherism (FRESHERS DAY) to introduce the new students to the culture of the campus and to make them comfortable. The event is organized by the seniors with the assistance of the faculty members in the institution. The University has a record of having no instances of ragging with proactive measures taken by the monitoring committee and sensitizing students as per the directives of UGC.

Promoting the concept of Positive Psychology, the University follows the PERMA model (Positive-Emotions, Engagement, Positive Relationship, Meaning and Accomplishment) under the guidance of the Counseling Centre – Department of Psychology, School of Social Sciences. The activities include individual capacity building counselling and developmental group activities.

The global perspective of education was enhanced through a study abroad programme in France and Spain. The MOUs were signed with 13 Universities across the globe for knowledge transfer and cultural exchange.

The University provides state of the art infrastructure and facilities to ensure physical fitness and wellness of the students. The University funds the students to participate in state and national level sports meets to keep up the sportsmanship spirit and display the talent acquired from GCU through the rigorous sports training. To list a few, the students have won various tournaments, man of the match awards and all-rounder awards in different s ports meets.

Leading the way

The dynamic and progressive leadership of the University is reflected in the various initiatives that are oriented to the needs of the current generation. The scheduled academic audits are in place to ensure optimum performance at all schools in the University and Administrative audits, checks and balances are in place to monitor the operational and support units of the University. The feedback and grievances from different stakeholders are closely monitored and they act as true inputs for improvising the functioning of the University. The checks and balances are in place to monitor the activities of the University 360 degree. Automated systems are in place to

avoid human error. In order to achieve better efficiency, e-governance is in place by ensuring complete automation of the examination processes and updating of student portal and staff portal. The statutory bodies and units of the University ensure a motivating work and study environment by providing equal and unbiased opportunity irrespective of caste, creed, gender and economic backgrounds.

Beyond Education

GCU initiated several best practices like Integration of graduate and postgraduate curricula with research, Culinary Studio, Multi-sectoral industry visits focused on learning and knowledge sharing and practicing Yoga are some of the highlights of the report.

Realizing the opportunities ahead and the future of students to enhance the entrepreneurship and employment skills various activities were conducted by the placement department.





- 38.9 The Teaching Staff appointed in the University shall ordinarily retire on attaining the age of 62 years.

The Non-Teaching Staff appointed in the University shall ordinarily retire on attaining the age of 60 years.

The Board of Management shall have the power to permit any retiring Teaching and Non Teaching staff to continue to serve in the University even after retirement as per conditions laid down by it from time to time.

All such appointments shall be approved by the Board of Governors.

The Board of Management agreed to recommend the approval of the said Clauses in the University Statutes for to the Board of Governors.

Agenda: Consideration of draft Garden City University Annual Report - 2018-19.

Resolutions:

The University commenced its academic activities for the second year in June 2018 and continued with the efforts to run all its programmes in an atmosphere of high discipline, strong academic commitment and transparency effectively as in the past. Draft Annual Report of the University consisting of academic activities, co-curricular activities and achievements for the academic year 2018-19 submitted was discussed and decided to place the same before the next Board of Governors Meeting for its approval.

New Policy for admissions:


Resolutions:

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES



Terrace Gardening

The department of life sciences organized a workshop on Terrace Gardening for the people in the neighbouring areas of the University on the 15th of February 2020.

The programme was conducted as an initiative to promote gardening among the public. The limitation of land area in every household has been a challenge for anybody interested in gardening. Terrace gardening is a novel concept for those interested in gardening. By this mode of gardening one could develop not only greenery around which provides fresh air, but also grow their own vegetables and fruits which are purely organic.

The workshop had participants from over 50 households in and around the campus. The workshop was organized in co-ordination with horticulturists from Lalbagh who gave the necessary inputs to the people on the entire concept. The sessions involved demonstration of the steps that are involved in creating a terrace garden from scratch. Every participant was given free saplings of ornamental plants and seeds. There was a sale of grow bags, seeds and various tools that could help anyone to commence a process of gardening at home.

Medicinal plants gardening training:

Plants are the best source of medicines and every plant is surely known to be of some medicinal value. The University has a well-maintained medicinal plant garden which has been managed by the department of life sciences.

The department had organized a training on medicinal plants for the general public on account of the Global Wellness day on 13th June 2019. Experts from the horticultural department as well as experts from the field of Unani medicine sensitized the participants on the various types of easily available medicinal plants which can be grown in every household and also encouraged them to grow these plants in their homes as easy remedies for some of the common ailments. Few of the common medicinal plants that are grown in the medicinal garden are Rosemary, Lavender, Aloe Vera, Thyme, Celery, Sunflowers, Tulsi. It was a very informative and enlightening session. Saplings of medicinal plants were distributed free to all symbolic to the Global Wellness day. The training had participants from school students in the vicinity of the University campus, participants included

general public from the neighbourhood. Over all there were 200 participants.

Promotion to exercise Electoral Franchise

The school of media studies took the onus of spreading awareness in the vicinity of the campus to make people exercise their franchise during the Loksabha elections scheduled in the 3rd week of April 2019. The media students created a questionnaire that would elicit response from the general public in terms of whether they would exercise their franchise in the forthcoming elections. The team of students were divided into four categories in order to interview people who would speak in Kannada, English, Hindi and Telugu as the demography around the campus had people speaking these languages. There was a mixed response from the general public. The response from the general public was made into a three minutes video with voice over done in Kannada, English, Hindi and Telugu. The same was promoted on social media and evoked a good response. The students had the opportunity to showcase the video to the sitting MLA and the corporators of the opposition party. These entire activities reached out to more than 300 households in and around the vicinity of the campus.

Computer and Internet Usage Basic Training.

As a part of the University Social Responsibility (USR) activities, Garden City University facilitated extension activities like training school students on Usage of Computer and Basic training on Internet Usage. The School of Computational Sciences and Information Technology identified 2 schools near to the campus -Shishu Mandir and Government Primary School, Mandur. The Department of Computer Science organized a 2-day workshop for the school students enabling them to get an awareness on the basic usage of internet and how to access online study materials for their education.

The team conducted a general awareness session for the teachers of both the school on the usage of banking applications like Googlepay and PhonePay. This enabled the teachers to get an awareness on Cashless wallet. The workshop was conducted on 16-July 2019 at Shishu Mandir and on 17-July-2019 at Government School, Mandur. The students and the teachers of both the schools appreciated the efforts taken by Garden City University.

Coping with stress and developing adversity quotient

As a part of the extension activities under the School of Social Sciences, the Department of Psychology conducted a 2-days counselling session at Garden City University on 26th & 27th August 2019. The counselling session was mainly focused on students who attempted their competitive examinations and were not able to make it. Mr. Rajesh Fernando, Value Communicator, was invited on both the days. There was a great turnout of students rural and urban schools who attended the programme. This counselling session was a great sigh of relief to the students who attended the same. They realized the different career opportunities which they had never thought of till then. Parents acknowledged this great event conducted by the University as they could see smiling faces of their wards. They were enlightened about various career opportunities that they could not even dream of till then.

Parents requested the University to conduct such events in future as well

Teen health and Encouraging healthy practices among teen through Teenathon

Teenagers are the most vulnerable in the society with the advancement of technology especially the screen time being the killer. Obesity is also a major problem with teens not exercising and continuously binging on junk food. Garden City University as a part of its social responsibility conducted a half marathon run exclusively for the teens on 10th November 2019. As an incentive, teens who participated in the run were given a free entry if accompanied by a parent which was also to promote camaraderie between the parent and the teenager. Over 550 participants flooded the main road in front of the campus on the Sunday morning exhibiting their racing skills. The half marathon route crisscrossed six villages and a portion of forest land making the run very scenic and adventurous. With 65 medical volunteer from the physiotherapy department, 82 NSS volunteers and 40 management trainees to assist the runners, the event was well appreciated and perhaps could achieve its objective of inculcating a healthy habit among teenagers.

Jute bag making training workshop

Department of Fashion and Apparel Design organized a one-day jute bag making training workshop on 7th February 2020 for the lady homemakers from Kithaganur village area. The training program covered brief introduction on different designs of jute bags, selection of raw material, material use of different sizes, preparation of utility items like marketing bags, ladies bags and use of matching colour on the jute product. This skill development program was designed to help elicit

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entrepreneurial aspiration among the attendees to set up jute manufacturing units.

Through the workshop, people were made aware about the usage of jute bags, e.g., for shopping purpose, travel purposes, as laptop bags, document folder, etc. The workshop also emphasized on the fact that, since the required machineries and raw materials used for its manufacture are easily available from indigenous sources and as not much technology is involved, factories can also be established easily anywhere. The objective of the workshop was successfully achieved as many of the participants wanted more detail regarding setting up of jute manufacturing factories, government concession and regulations.

English language training in government schools

School of Indian and Foreign Languages organized a oneday English language training for the students of standard 9 and 10 of four government schools in the vicinity of the university on 7th January 2020. The programme was conducted simultaneously at all the four schools, namely, Government High School Bidarahalli, Government Higher Primary School Bendiganahelli, Government High School Katamnallur and Government High School Doddabanahalli. Faculty members and students from the University got involved in training these school students through various active engagement techniques.

The government school students were elated after encountering English language learning in such a unique way. They actively participated in each and every activity organized. The event helped around 400 students of these government schools in learning English in a different way. The students were also made aware about the importance of English language as a factor for future job prospects in the city. The event was conducted successfully evoking participation from the students of both the university and the schools in creating a better learning environment.

Horticulture training and exhibition

School of Sciences at Garden City University participated in a one-week long horticultural exhibition organized at Lalbagh botanical gardens as a precursor to the Lalbagh Flower Show from 20th January till 25th January 2020. This initiative was to encourage first time gardeners who on account of paucity of time do not tend to such a hobby. The University stall showcased more than 500 kinds of flowering plants, medicinal plants and ornamental plants grown in the campus. Manned by 52 University students, the stall saw more than 10000 people visiting to

witness the wonderful collection of plants and more than 1000 customers purchased plants from various categories

The university stall also introduced ETG kit (Easy to Grow) for the first time in Lalbagh Flower Show, which was designed in the university campus itself. Overall response received as feedback from nearly 2000 customers who have visited our stall during the exhibition was quite encouraging and heartening. Maximum footfall happened on the final day of the exhibition, The Lalbagh Flower Show day on 26th January 2020.

Physio training for trail walkers

Trail walking and trail running has overtaken regular marathons that identifies cities today. Especially, in a trail race, it is very essential that the runner has adept physical fitness. GCU School of Health Sciences has regularly extended its services to such runners and in particular, it is the official physiotherapy partner for Oxfam trailwalker. 120 physiotherapy students were part of the Oxfam trailwalker that was held on 7th and 8th February 2020. The physiotherapy students conducted the warmup session with a Zumba performance. They were posted all along the scenic trailwalking track and assisted over 1000 participants throughout the race.

Kadima Belle- Arogaya Karwatha Jeevana Paniya

The concept of Kadima Belle- Arogaya Karwatha Jeevana Paniya is to train the N.S.S. Volunteers to use the locally available medicinal plants and flowers and create a healthy beverage by using those plants and flowers. This skill development workshop includes usage of hibiscus flower, mango leaves, guava leaves, punnai flowers, basil seeds, and tulsi to create healthy and tasty beverages. Hibiscus flower is rich in Vitamin-C, Mango leaves are rich in antioxidant and anti-viral properties and considered to cure diabetes, Guava leaves, and Punnai flowers also have similar properties. The advantage of using locally available medicinal plants and flowers includes better health and wellness, cost-effectiveness, and utilization of the freely/easily available resources. The bio-diversity of India favours the experimentation of the above concept. The N.S.S. volunteers have understood the concept of Low Cost- Locally Available Healthy Beverages, skills to grow the medicinal plants and flowers, and the procedure to create healthy beverages. The main objective of training the N.S.S. Volunteers is to create an opportunity for the N.S.S. Volunteers to share their learning with stakeholders while conducting N.S.S. activities. Every N.S.S. Volunteer must create awareness about the "Low Cost- Locally Available Healthy Beverages in their respective colleges, neighbouring schools, and families. The above activity was conducted by School of Professional Studies, Department of Hospitality Management & Catering Technology as part of the extension activity to N.S.S. Volunteers during the Special Camp organized for 'National Service Scheme (N.S.S.) Golden Jubilee Celebrations 2019'. The workshop was held on 3rd July 2019.

Filing IT Returns

The Income Tax Department, Government of India spends cores of rupees for creating awareness among the citizens of India regarding the filing of income tax. Among the taxes collected direct taxes forms a major component of the government's income. The direct taxes collected amounts to about 11 lakhs crore per year. This is considering the fact that there is still a large population who are unable to pay their taxes due to various reasons.

GCU took the initiative of reaching out people in the neighbourhood to assist them in filing their returns, for free. Usually when this is done by a charted accountant or any other professional firm a tax payer is charged upwards of Rs.500/- for one individual's returns to be filed. The Department of Commerce and Management studies reached out to 150+ tax payers during a one week campaign.

Blood Donation Camp

The requirement of blood in India is about 13.1 million units per year as per WHO, that's about 1% of the population of India. Various studies have indicated that Indian blood banks on an average has been able to collect only about 9 million units per year. This leaves a huge gap in meeting the Nation's requirement and may cripple the health care system.

GCU Blood donation camps organised have student volunteers contributing about 350-400 units of blood per year. This is about 15% of the student population on the campus. These camps are organised aligning to the National day celebrations of India.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Camp

Brest cancer is one among the most common cancer in Indian women and accounts for 27% of all cancers in Women. About 1 in 28 women are likely to develop breast cancer during their lifetime. In the urban areas the incidence is 1 in 22 as compared to the rural areas where 1 in 60 women develop breast cancer. In India, cervical cancer contributes to approximately 17.5% of all cancers in women.

With this premise GCU conducted awareness workshop for students, faculties and community stakeholders from

the neighbourhood to create awareness among them. The camp also taught the participants the procedure to check for breast cancer. Vaginal swab for cervical cancer test were collected and test done for free. The camp reached out to about 1000+ participants.

Title of the Practice:

Encourage student involvement in research-oriented publications.

Objectives of the Practice

Title of the Practice

Culinary Studio

Objectives of the Practice

The main objective of culinary studio is to provide a platform to the students to learn hospitality business while actually at work. It helps develop interpersonal skills, communication and team work ability of the students that would be useful to every candidate in professional as well as personal life. Also it improves the entrepreneurial skills of the student.

The Context

The University recognizes the need to expose the students to industry work culture through continuous interaction and hands on training during the course. The exposure to real time situations and environment gives them the sense of being a professional. Practice, use of equipment and adaptability of newer technology is possible through industrial exposure. Being a global industry, it is necessary to make students ready for international career and adapt to multicultural work environment. It is also imperative to go hand in hand with industry; faculty members are also encouraged to improve understanding of latest trends, techniques and procedure. This is inculcated in the University activities. Interaction with industry also helps the University in enriching and complementing the curriculum.

The Practice

Student's personal development: Students are encouraged to make groups and put up their own stalls. Promotion of the event is done by the students alone. Students handle their stalls throughout the day and try to attract maximum crowd. The dominating attraction are the food stalls that serve a huge variety of foods and non-alcoholic drinks from kebabs to street foods, from Pizzas, Pastas to Cakes and Pastries and Bakery delicacies. The group of students work in team coordinating with each other to make the event a successful one in terms of hospitality, quality, learning experience, profitability, coordination and most importantly team work development.

Evidence of Success

Students have successfully acquainted with global practices in hospitality industry. Students have learned to think out of the box and present themselves with more confidence. One can easily appreciate the professional touch that the students have optained after the event. Many of the students have been coming up with their own business plans to set up small food outlets, juice corners and so on. They have adopted the professional work culture with improved technical and interpersonal skills. They have become confident and more adaptive to latest hospitality practices and shown ease of working in different situations. The placements in best hotel brands in India and abroad is witnessed in recent years. Culinary Studios have helped in improving the curriculum & knowledge

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Any event has its positives as well as negatives. Annual Food Festivals is no exception. It had few negative points as well as many positive aspects also. Department of Commerce and Management Studies

Title of the Practice

Multi-sectoral industry visit based learning and knowledge sharing

Objectives of the Practice

An Industrial visit is an essential component in the teach-learning process and every student after completion of their studies eventually will become an integral part of this ecosystem, as an employee or an employer.

A broad perspective of various types of business and how they function and thrive in the real world is essential. Every concept learnt in the classroom is connected and related during an Industrial visit.

This concept intends to re-look at the conventional form of industrial visit to more organized and goal-oriented visits to ensure an effective learning process. It also brings about a perspective of Knowledge dissemination.

The specific objective is that the students get an opportunity to visit multiple sectors, have a focused industrial visit and an opportunity to present and share their learning.

Challenges faced in the conventional method of operation

- · Low level of engagement during the visit.
- Little or no learning experience.
- Mindset and attitude of going on a picnic rather than an educational tour.
- Increases herd mentality among students blocking selfinstigated thinking.
- A high span of control for the Faculty member accompanying.
- · The concept intends to address the following:
- The monotony of the type of company or industry visited
- Ideal batch size of students
- · Ascertaining learning benefits for students
- Efficient use of Institutional resources

The Practice

Conventional understanding:

Industrial visits are an eye-opener for students who are either studying management or a job-specific course. The objective behind such visits is to lessen the gap between classroom lessons and practical working environment. When a student visits the industry his decision of what he wants to become and his career choice strengthens. A college can organize two kinds of industry visits, with the permission and cooperation of the companies. One would be a half a day trip where students get an overview of the industry and the work environment. The other kind would be more of an industry or organization study where students get to spend a few days in an organization and learn about the working of each department and each personnel in detail. This would help him make better decisions regarding his line of career.

Importance of an Industrial Visit

- Helps a student gain first-hand information about the industry, organization and the work environment
- Helps them relate to classroom lessons better
- Provides an insight into the real working conditions of an industry thus helping students make the right decision
- They get guidance and mentoring in their field once they decide on what they want to pursue
- Gives them insight into their future
- Builds a relationship between industries and institutes
- Helps organizations create brand awareness
- Helps students build interpersonal and communication skills
- Makes them less nervous about their career and gives them more clarity
- Helps them understand the do's and don't's of industry practices

Industry visits sensitize students to the practical challenges an industry or organization faces every day. It also helps students plan. Encourages them to give in their inputs, ideas, feedback and suggestions on what they perceive of not only the tour but the organization as well. This exercise will get them job-ready and prepared for the real world before they hit the ground running. It also sensitizes them to the working conditions of the lower rung of workers so that they learn to appreciate every bit of effort put in by every worker, even the janitor for instance and teach them to respect workers and be better leaders in the future.

Uniqueness

- A student gets a chance to visit at least 10 different industry sectors during their period of study.
- Students are divided into small batches of 15 students.
- After the return from the visit, the students in groups of 5 share their experience through a presentation to their peers and engage in a discussion.

Evidence of Success

- The concept was well appreciated by the students and the companies.
- The students were able to interact with the personnels in the company more effectively.
- The students were able to see and hear processes and procedures better rather than being left out at the end of the crowd.
- The students were able to ask specific questions.
- Small numbers were easy for the company to handle and provide access to constrained areas in case of a large crowd
- The faculty members were able to monitor the students closely and ensure discipline
- Where ever able to get hands-on where ever possible and allowed by the company without fear of losing a chance or delays.
- The students were able to discuss and reproduce their learning with their peers more effectively.
- The students gained a chance to pick and choose the types of industries/companies they wanted to visit.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- The concept requires intensive and close monitoring of groups to ensure that every student gets a chance.
- The number of companies to gain permission from substantially increased.
- Matching the time allocation from the company to the academic calendar and time table was a challenge.
- Constant follow-up with companies for schedule/ cancellation/rescheduling of appointments.

Objectives of the Practice

- To break the notion that a computer science student is just confined to a computer.

Context and Challenges

Computer science students traditionally tend to be engrossed in the programme and development of system components. There are several instances when the students who are talented and brilliant fail to interact with people and express their ideas and its influences on common man's life.

Challenges to overcome

Inhibition of expression Delay in identification of talent Practical use case scenario of a process / innovation Lack of presentation skills

The Practice

Students identify various areas of interest in computer science and bring out their creation in a team. They prepare a working model and place it on display for critical evaluation. The entire project is monitored by a faculty

Evidence of Success

The students to have gone through this process has shown to built confidence and have expressed the following:

School of Professional Studies -Department of Fashion & Apparel Design

Title of the Practice

Designs with social impact

Objectives of the Practice

The concept of fashion design envisaged in a social context and practical dress designing. The students are trained to identify various professions and people from day today living circumstance and contemplate on comfortable, practical, green and affordable clothes for them.

Context and Challenges

The fashion world is often associated with glamour and luxury, and seldom seen as a something that is more basic in nature. Even though this notion has transformed over the years there are very few designers and professionals who actually design practical fashion.

Challenges to overcome:

Mindset about fashion Use of impractical design Faulty selection of materials Wrong understanding of eco-design

The Practice

The students identify various job requirements at the grassroot level and design clothing that could make their work more efficient and effective. They take up already conceived designs and improvise them to adapt to the local needs and demands. This is done in pairs as a project mentored by faculty members.

Evidence of Success

Students start to develop a keen eye for observation and reasoning of practicality for every design that they create. The blend of creativity and use of practical design techniques have been lauded at several fashion forums. The students understand that fashion is not just mix and match of colors and fancy shapes but it should also be access able and useable.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Several challenges were faced while implementing this concept including breaking the mindset of students

and persuading them to look at fashion in a new light. For many, transformation of ideas, to drawings on paper and final creation of product came across as real challenge. The students tend to drop the projects if not closely monitored and mentored.

School of Media Studies Department of Journalism and Mass Communication / Department of Electronic Media

Title of the Practice

Event media coverage planning

Objectives of the Practice

To enable students to learn the nuances of planning a media coverage using all the mediums i.e., print, visual, online, radio effectively to reach out to the stakeholders within and outside the campus.

Context and Challenges

This was introduced to overcome the timidness of a fresh graduate while entering the real life media production houses and show certain level of acquaintance of handling media coverage projects in the industry.

Challenges that are taught to overcome:

Ineffective Pre-event Media publicity
Ill planned social media campaigns
Poor use of media production equipment
Lack of acquaintance of the guests and personalities
expected at the event

The Practice

Students are divided into multiple groups and assigned with specific responsibilities in pairs. Every group reports to a mentor faculty who would provide them with instructions and guidance. Every activity planned is sent to a professional to review and comment. The reviewed and approved plan is executed by the student.

Evidence of Success

Students started to evolve a sense of confidence as there is a preparation phase involved and an external professional review that enhances perspective.

It is seen that the students after being involved in 4 -5 well planned and reviewed media coverage activities display an exceptionally high adaptability to perform those tasks they are trained at when there is a pressing situation and short notice. This definitely showcases the increase in the confidence level and courage to face contingencies.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

As event planning and media management can be very dynamic in nature with several changes during the course of planning and on the day of the event, the entire process can be a stressor for students and faculty members. To

match the industry standard operation protocols at the academic or campus levels may at times seem too difficult.

School of Health Sciences - Department of Physiotherapy

Title of the Practice

Multimodal teaching learning process.

Objectives of the Practice

Physiotherapy is a skill-based health care profession, students of Physiotherapy are taught affective, cognitive and psychomotor skills by addressing different types of learners such as visual, auditory and kinesthetic learners. Objective of this practice is to enhance knowledge and hands on skills of students with human touch. Students need to effectively communicate and bring out patients' potential problems and relate their issues with basic understanding of clinical reasoning and also it is essential to disseminate the available information to educate patients for prevention and precaution as required to maintain health. Goal setting and intervention are the two main outcomes of the program which will be achieved by this practice.

The Context

Categorizing learners is the foremost important task as some are visual learners and others are auditory or kinesthetic learners, so the curriculum is developed keeping in mind practical, theory and clinical training which gives equal importance. In multimodal teaching or training methods, delivery of contents done by lecture, online educational resources such as video and reading content are shared. Case studies and real time simulation practice by model demonstration is adapted to enhance practical skills before practicing on patients, clinical training and hospital postings to improve the psychomotor skills of students. Similarly workshops on advanced skill training are conducted on regular basis which would be technically upper hand for our students to beat competition in job market.

The Practice

The main idea of multimodal learning is the effective use of multiple modalities, or delivery methods, in training. Research shows that most training leaders believe offering multiple modalities is vital for training success. Technology enables multimodal learning through mobile apps, e-learning platforms, simulations, practical clinical training and other modalities. It also helps to ensure retention and application by reinforcing content over a longer time period. The process of multimodal training begins with identifying affective, cognitive and psychomotor skill requirements for students for various courses. It is basically Learner centric as students have multiple options to utilize resources that best suit them. We offer training for affective skills enhancement by role play, video presentation and hospital visits. To improve cognitive skills online content, lecture and library research are used and to improve psychomotor, skills simulation, practical classes, hospital training, field visit and camps are done. Overall outcome is measured objectively, if any shortfall if found will be rectified.

Evidence of Success

Student who are trained in multimodal delivery of medical education in physiotherapy are evaluated in different parameter such as continuous internal assessment and end semester examination. The post graduate students obtained 100% result in all semester and the employability skills are assessed based on the placement record as 100% as the I batch MPT students are placed in various institution and organization. Student and parents feedback found to be effective, if the best practice adopted by the department of physiotherapy hence working well.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Clinical training needs extensive infrastructure such as arrangements with several hospitals. As of now we are utilizing available hospital beds for clinical and practical training. There is a need to increase the clinical facility to accommodate BPT and MPT students.

School of Social Sciences - Department of Psychology

Title of the Practice

- a. Counselling services to all
- b. Innovative teaching methods

Objectives of the Practice

- a. Counselling center is set up for all members of the University irrespective of staff and students. Services are provided to deal with financial, physical, attendance, personal issues of all.
- b. The department follows a variety of innovative teaching methods like model making, identify your personality, chart making , community services.

The Context

- a. This practice has been made to all students to understand that they can freely open up to a counsellor when in distress
- b. This is used to help students understand the subject matter of Psychology better and make teachinglearning fun

The Practice

- a. Counsellors who train students in counselling.
- b. The counsellors help keep up with the interests of the students.

Evidence of Success

- a. Counseling center is a must in all educational institutions. It is needed for students in distress to portray what they are feeling openly. NAAC and UGC also recommend the same. We have faced lot of difficulties running it successfully as we do not have a proper set up to keep the center going.
- b. Innovative teaching practices are a mandate to keep up with the new generation. Students need to be taught with interesting methods failing which their attention span will be affected greatly. It has been a challenge for teachers also to update themselves and teach students bearing everything in mind.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- a. We have successfully counselled more than 40 students in the last 1 year and 15 cases have been recommended for help from outside. We require a counselling center with basic amenities to keep this going.
- b. We have come up with more than 10 innovative teaching practices in the last year. We look forward to coming up with more unique practices in the next academic year.

School of Indian & Foreign Languages

Title of the Practice

Book Reading and Narration

Objectives of the Practice

Students are encouraged to pick a chapter and read it to an audience and narrate the background, thought, setting of the piece read.

The Context:

The students studying languages are expected to have exceptional reading, writing and speaking skills with sufficient knowledge of literature. This activity helps them to overcome challenges in:

Reading aloud Narration Interpretation skills Confidence Presentation skills

The Practice

The student along with a faculty guide chooses a chapter from a novel or a poem and a study is done on the author, book and the writing. Once the entire preparations are complete and approved the student presents this in a special setting where in the student is seated before an audience, under a spot light, does an introduction of the piece, reads the piece and then narrates the thoughts in their own perspective.

Evidence of Success

The students started developing confidence in expressing their thoughts, doing a detailed literature review, their understanding of various writers and their styles improved substantially.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Identifying the right work to be presented was a challenge. In certain instances there may be very few material available to do a research.






Universitel


The library is the 'heart' of any academic institution. The library which has a collection of over 34000 books covering relevant subjects including general books for all users.

The Library functions from 8.00 am to 10.00 pm on all days of the week including public holidays. Library provides wide range of services to support and enhance student learning at the campus.










