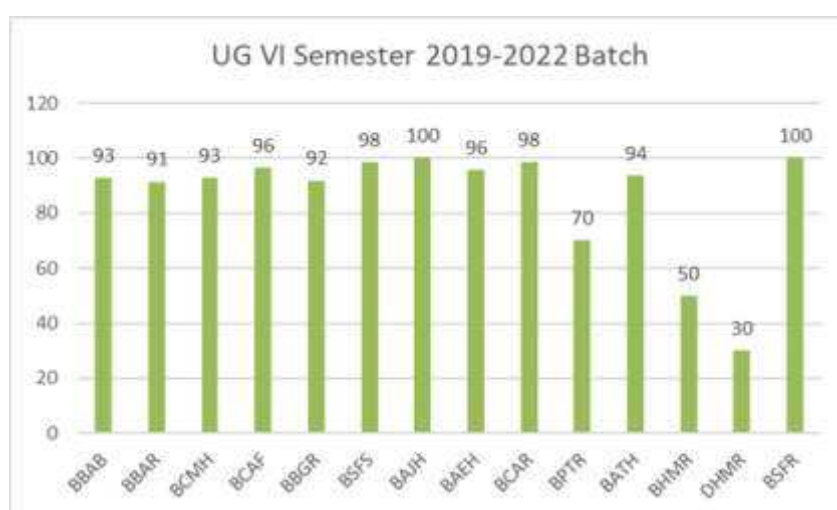
STUDENTS ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE 2022-23

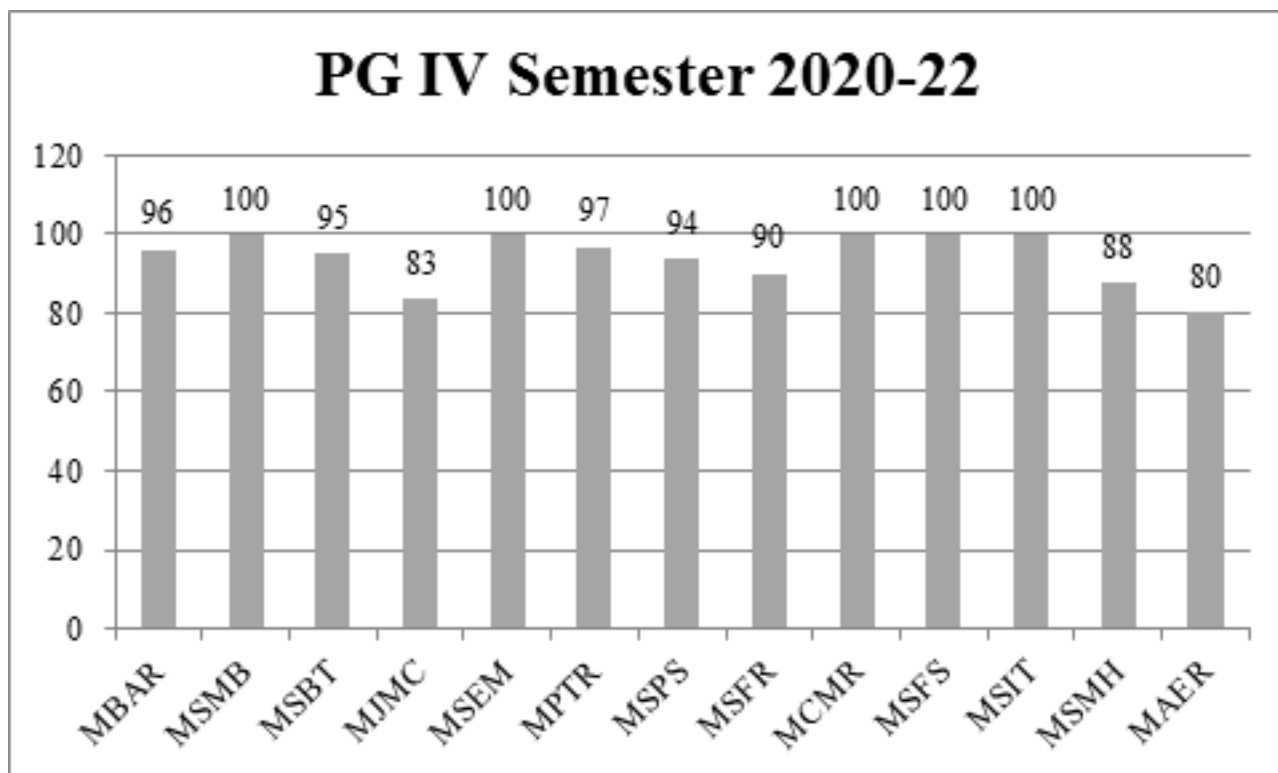

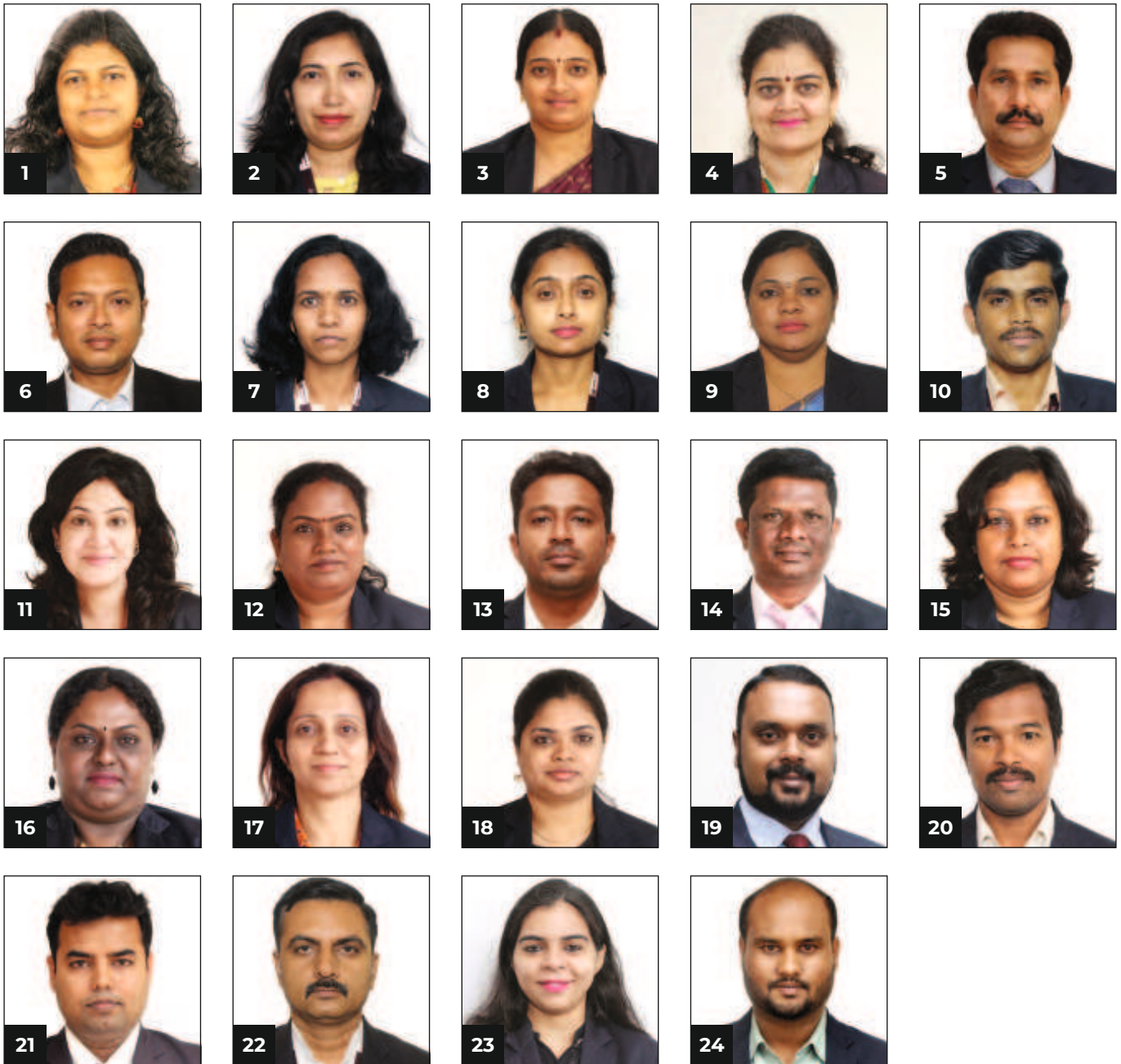

Description of the Project	<p>Anaemia is one of the most widespread nutritional deficiencies of blood which affect the populations of all ages throughout the world, children and adolescents being at a significantly higher risk for the condition. Medicinal plants have been a source of succour in the control of many diseases in developing countries and anaemia is no exception. Treatment of anaemia involves an iron-rich diet, iron and vitamin supplements. Iron supplements that are commercially available, if consumed too much of which can lead to circumstances like Hemochromatosis and Neurogenetic Disorders. In this study extracts of different plants (Moringa oleifera Lamk. Psidium guajava L, Trigonella foenum-graecum, Sesamum Indicum) are examined for their iron content to formulate a native sweet made of Till (sesame), rich iron product to put forth as a solution to iron deficiency. Protocol was standardized to formulize herbal iron Till Laddus (a sweet made with sesame seeds) with much higher iron content and bio availability to make it available for easy use for the society.</p>
Outcome	<p>It provides the fortification in a traditional sweet, made of Till and jaggery and fortified with herbal supplements. It can be made by the local Women Self Help Groups and this can be their source of livelihood. This means that the local populace themselves are preparing this and hence they have a vested interest in this programme succeeding</p> <p>As these are made locally, the confidence factor of them having known items is high and hence, adherence to the regimen will be high. The programme can be monitored by the village panchayat/or even the SHG's to make sure that they do the regular follow up with the participants . The SHG's can even sell these to the State Food Corporations/Agencies for packaging and selling in co-operative societies. This approach echoes the global sentiment of "Go Local" and has a higher percentage of success.</p>

CONSULTANCY

4. CONSULTANCY:

The faculty members at Garden City University are encouraged to share their expertise outside the four walls of the classrooms. Beyond sharing their expertise, the consultancy services also help faculty members strengthen their industry-relevant skills and applications while providing consultancy services. In addition, the Consultancy service also provides an opportunity for industry-academia innovation collaborations. Notable consultancy project completed by Garden City University is provided below.

Destination Consultant - Guide Training Programme

Garden City University in association with Kalyana Karnataka Development Board has jointly organized 6 days 'Destination Consultant Training Programme' between 21st March 2023 and 26th March 2023. The workshop aimed at imparting the theoretic and practical knowledge among the youth of North Karnataka about how to earn additional income by involving themselves in Tourism Business Activities. To impart the skills among the people of North Karnataka, the workshop was organized.

The Kalyana Karnataka Development Board, under the scholarly guidance of Shri. Basavaraj Patil Sedam, Honourable MP of Gulbarga, had selected 18 aspirants from his constituency to attend 6 days training programme organized by the Department of Tourism, Garden City University. These 18 participants belong to various age group from 18 years to 60 years, who are keen to find future in tourism industry. Garden City University has received a grant of Rs. 3,17,500 from the Government of Karnataka for the successful implementation of this programme.

Faculty members from the Department of Tourism, Media and Indian and Foreign Languages have conducted theoretical and practical sessions on various topics such as, Introduction to tourism in Karnataka and Kalyana Karnataka, map reading session, entrepreneurship in tourism, social media promotion, do's and don'ts of tourism, role play, effective communication in tourism and marketing the tourism sites and also practical sessions on designing website, effective photography and videography, and designing an itinerary. NSS Activities Report – 2022-2023

The NSS Unit of Garden City University was established with the objective of inculcating the mindset social responsibility and social service among the student community. Garden City University has two NSS units comprising of 400 plus students from across various schools, who strive for the betterment of their surroundings.

The University has adopted 5 villages and 5 schools, and through the NSS units' various activities and awareness camps are conducted to benefit the local community and students. With the objective of 'Not Me, But You', Garden City University organizes responsible practices in these villages. Some of the skill development and entrepreneurship skill enhancement programs are;

1. Self-reliance camp for Rural Women

Objective: The camp was held in Veeranahalli with the objective of encouraging the rural women to take up entrepreneurship activities.

Nature of Workshop: In association with the Department of Fashion and Apparel Design the local women were had a workshop on mask making, jewelry making and stitching. 20 students from Garden City University have participated in the workshop.

Outcome: About 30 local women were benefitted from the workshop. Few follow up sessions were held and the feedback shown that the local community are self-reliable in making their own products.

2. Physio camp, community survey

Objective: The physio-camp was organized at Thorahanalli village of Kolar Taluk to create awareness about the health and hygiene among the rural community.

Nature of Workshop: The faculty members of the department of Physiotherapy along with the students have joined the camp to conduct the health camp. Body check-up, bone and joint check-up were conducted. Our team had also conducted a community survey on health practices among the local people.

Outcome: Around 50 villagers were the beneficiaries of the health camp. Through the community



3. Health and Hygiene Cooking Workshop for Rural Women

Objective: A workshop on health and hygiene was conducted at Doddabanahalli village of Bangalore Rural taluk. The workshop aimed at imparting the health and hygiene knowledge among the local community.

Nature of Workshop: The NSS unit in association with the department of Hotel Management has organized this camp to the rural women. The beneficiaries were inducted to the hygiene factors in the kitchen and also the usage of ingredients that has higher nutritious value. A demo on healthy cooking was conducted.

Outcome: Around 30 women from the village were the benefitted from the workshop. The event was highly successful that, the NSS unit is getting follow up calls to conduct more such events.



4. Vermi-compost Workshop, Gerupura

Objective: A Vermi-Compost was held with the objective of inspiring and attracting the farmers towards sustainable and organic farming.

Nature of Workshop: Workshop was held in Gerupura, one of the adopted villages of our University. 25 local farmers were participated and benefitted from the camp. The NSS unit in association with the department of Life Sciences conducted this hands-on training programme.

Outcome: 25 farmers of the village had taken part in the camp and they found it is interesting. A follow up camp will be conducted in six months.



5. Workshop on Painting and Artwork - Thoranahalli

Objective: The objective of the Painting and Art Workshop was to build creativity and skill among the school children aged between 8 to 14 years.

Nature of Workshop: The workshop was conducted in association with the department of Fashion and Apparel Design, in order to enhance the skills among the students and engaging them in various activities. Students were divided in to various groups according to the interest of them and dance, music and painting workshops were conducted.

Outcome: Around 80 students were benefitted from the workshop. The NSS students learnt about how to conduct an outbound teaching for skill development.



6. Workshop on Apiculture, Thoranahalli

Objective: We have conducted a workshop on Apiculture in association with the department of Life Sciences of the University. Dr. Bhargav, faculty – department of Life Sciences and also a well-known entrepreneur was the speaker for the workshop.

Nature of Workshop: As the students play key role in environmental protection and sustainable growth, the workshop was conducted to created awareness among the student community. A demo was conducted to show how the beekeeping is done and the benefits of bee-keeping.

Outcome: Around 40 students were benefitted from the workshop. They learnt about how the beekeeping can be done with minimum investment.



7. Home Gardening Awareness Camp and Distribution of various Medicinal Plants

Objective: As a part of home gardening awareness camp students of Garden City University visited and distributed various medicinal plants such as Tulsi, Hibiscus and Aloe vera in GCU adopted government schools and houses nearby GCU. This activity was done from School of Sciences. Dr. Madhu Malleshappa and Ms. Sharon, faculty – Department of Life Sciences and Forensic Sciences were part of the camp.


Title of the Practice	Multimodal teaching-learning process
Objectives of the Practice	<p>Physiotherapy is a skill-based healthcare profession, students of Physiotherapy are taught affective, cognitive and psychomotor skills by addressing different types of learners such as visual, auditory and kinesthetic learners. The objective of this practice is to enhance the knowledge and hands-on skills of students with human touch. Students need to effectively communicate and bring out patients' potential problems and relate their issues with a basic understanding of clinical reasoning and it is essential to disseminate the available information to educate patients on prevention and precaution as required to maintain health. Goal setting and intervention are the two main outcomes of the program which will be achieved by this practice.</p>
Context and Challenges	<p>Categorizing learners is the foremost important task as some are visual learners and others are auditory or kinesthetic learners, so the curriculum is developed keeping in mind practical, theory and clinical training which gives equal importance. In multimodal teaching or training methods, delivery of content is done by lecture, and online educational resources such as video and reading content are shared. Case studies and real-time simulation practice by model demonstration are adapted to enhance practical skills before practising on patients, clinical training and hospital postings to improve the psychomotor skills of students. Similarly, workshops on advanced skill training are conducted regularly, which would be technically beneficial for our students to beat the competition in the job market.</p>
The practices	<p>The main idea of multimodal learning is the effective use of multiple modalities, or delivery methods, in training. Technology enables multimodal learning through mobile apps, e-learning platforms, simulations, practical clinical training and other modalities. It also helps to ensure retention and application by reinforcing content over a longer time period. The process of multimodal training begins with identifying affective, cognitive and psychomotor skill requirements for students for various courses. It is basically learner-centric as students have multiple options to utilise resources that best suit them.</p>
Evidence of Success	<p>Students who are trained in multimodal delivery of medical education in physiotherapy is evaluated in a different parameter such as continuous internal assessment and end-semester examination. The postgraduate students obtained 95% results in all semesters and the employability skills are assessed based on the placement record as 100% as the MPT students are placed in various institutions and organizations. Student and parent feedback was found to be effective, so the best practice adopted by the Department of Physiotherapy is working well.</p>
Areas of improvement	<p>Clinical training needs extensive infrastructure. As of now, we are utilizing available hospital beds for clinical and practical training.</p>

Challenges:

recognition of their contributions.

4. **Enhancing Campus Accessibility:** The university needs to address concerns about the campus location by improving transportation facilities and connectivity to the city, ensuring that students can access internships, resources, and recreational facilities.
5. **Research Culture and Grantsmanship:** Building a strong research culture among faculty and students is essential to attract research grants. 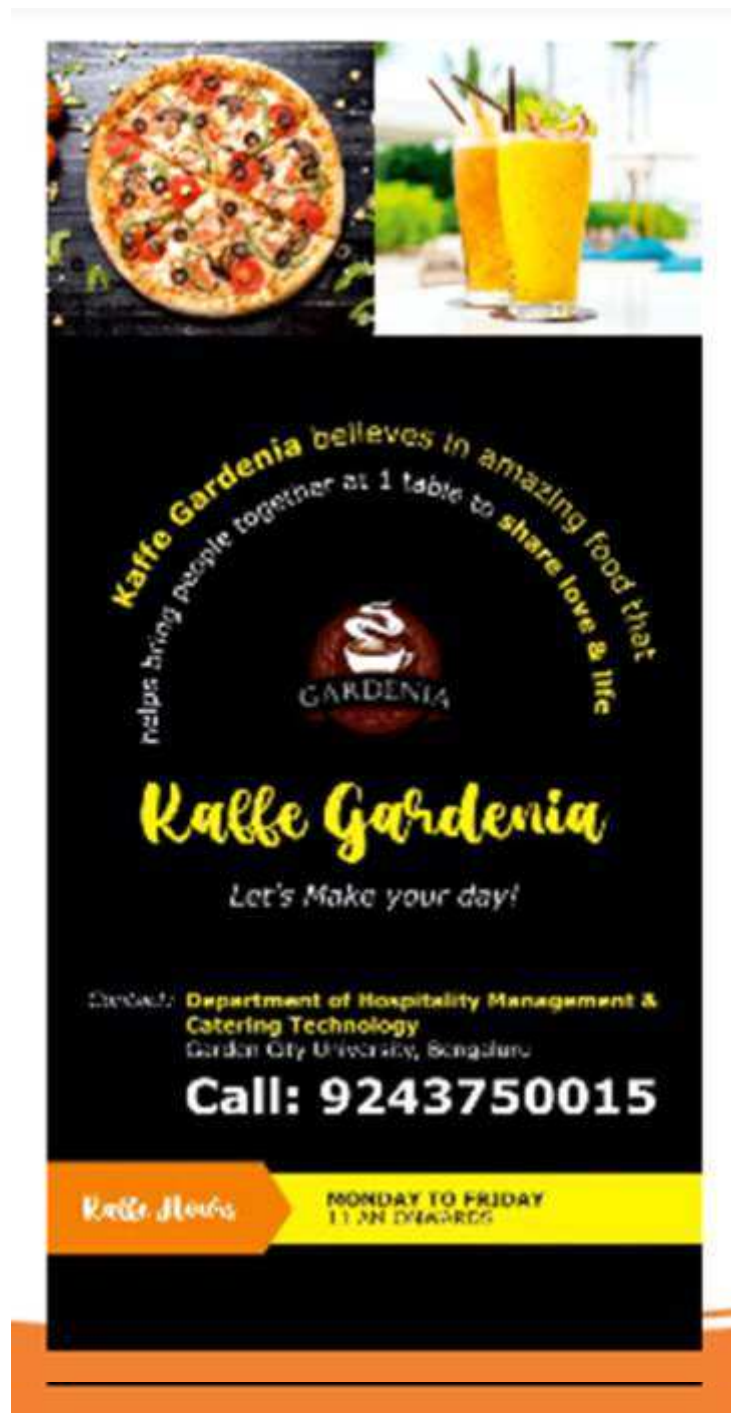
